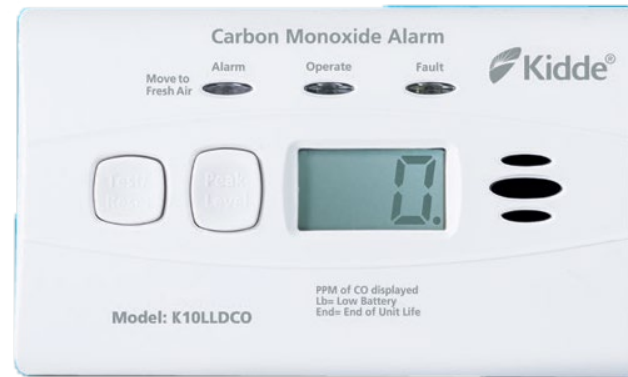


SAFETY MADE SIMPLE - CARBON MONOXIDE SAFETY TIPS

- Death

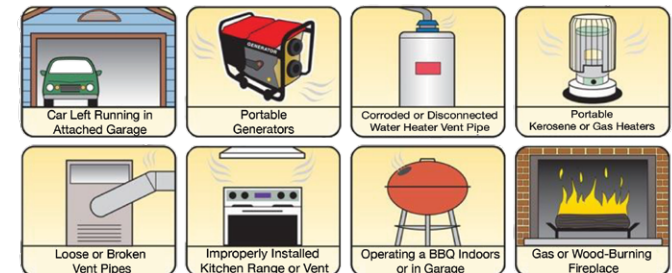
The only safe way to know if there is CO in your home is to arm your family with the appropriate CO alarm.
